

GGG+ forum in Tokyo 2018 Declaration

December 3, 2018

RESULTS Japan has organized GGG+ forum since 2016 towards the achievement of the universal health coverage (UHC).

The series of fora have increased interest in UHC both at home and abroad and led to the successes of conferences hosted by the government of Japan, such as the G7 Ise-Shima Summit and UHC Forum 2017. From August 28th to 30th 2019, TICAD 7 will be held. One of the important agenda items at TICAD 7 is going to be health. GGG+ forum in Kenya that was jointly held with the Kenyan government for the first time in July this year and was attended by Cabinet Secretary Cecily Kariuki of Kenya, Ministry of Health and representatives from various organizations that contribute to global health, including Global Fund, Gavi, GHIT Fund, WHO and UNICEF. A total of 240 participants joined to gain an understanding of the situation in the local areas directly and identify challenges for the realization of UHC in Africa. In 2019, G20 and TICAD 7 will be hosted, and in 2020 the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games will be hosted. Alongside these events, N4G Summit will be held in order for Japan to show leadership in the area of global health. It is necessary for the Japanese government, international institutions, academia, private sector, and civil society to be united in this effort. Therefore, for successful G20 and TICAD 7 in 2019, N4G summit in 2020, participants of GGG+ forum in Tokyo 2018: to accomplish TICAD 7 by Japan's experience hereby declare the following:

1. For the government of Japan to further exert leadership in controlling infectious diseases such as tuberculosis, HIV/AIDS, malaria, polio and NTDs, international agencies including GGG, the Global Fund, Gavi and GHIT Fund, and academia, corporates and civil societies will further strengthen collaboration and cooperation.
2. For the success of N4G Summit, which will be held alongside the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games in 2020, all stakeholders will cooperate to make progress in the nationwide efforts on nutrition and diet.
3. For the realization of UHC and SDGs, the Japanese government will lead in the efforts to promote public-private partnership by utilizing the Africa Human Wellbeing Initiative etc, which the government is formulating for TICAD 7.
